GAME, SET, EQUITY, COMMUNITY TENNIS GRANTS PRESENTED BY **NATIONAL BANK RETURN IN 2024**

The program has helped over 1,500 women and girls across 17 organizations since its inception

IMONTREAL, QCI March 18, 2024 - Tennis Canada is excited to announce the return of the 2024 Game, Set. Equity, Community Tennis Grants presented by National Bank, Designed to support organizations advancing equity in tennis, the program has awarded a total of 17 grants to date, directly impacting over 1,500 women and girls.

The Game. Set. Equity. Community Tennis Grants are part of Tennis Canada and National Bank's commitment to promoting equity and championing women and girls at all levels of tennis in Canada. Entering its third year, the program allows candidates to apply for funding up to a maximum of \$15,000.

"We've been able to support so many great organizations that are making a real difference in the lives of women and girls in tennis, and we're delighted to be able to continue to do so," said Terri Temelini, Director of Women & Girls Advancement, Tennis Canada. "We're looking for organizations with a clear plan on how they will use the grant to provide quality opportunities for girls and women to participate and develop leadership in tennis. We know there are many deserving groups out there, and we're eager to see the impactful projects that they will bring to the table."

This past October, the second round of grant recipients were announced, with 10 programs selected to receive \$5,000 each in funding. From helping women in the Northwest Territories receive coaching certifications, to empowering newcomers and immigrants to learn the sport of tennis in Quebec, to supporting wheelchair tennis programs for women in British Columbia, positive and lasting impacts continue to be made towards achieving equity. Local organizations interested in applying for a grant must meet certain eligibility requirements to be considered for selection. Initiatives must primarily focus on the participation, retention and/or advancement of self-identifying women and girls. That includes, but is not limited to:

- Increasing coaching, officiating, and/or next generation leadership opportunities.
- Increasing opportunities for girls and/or women to participate in programming, training, or competition.
- Supporting capacity building for equity work through education and training.

The application period for the 2024 grants closes on Tuesday, April 9 at 4 p.m. ET, therefore interested organizations are encouraged to submit their applications promptly.
