2025 FISCHER INDOOR JUNIOR NATIONALS ARE UNDERWAY

Canada's best juniors compete for top honours in the U12, U14, U16, and U18 divisions

[TORONTO, ON] March 21, 2025 – The next generation of Canadian tennis players is set to take to the courts for the 2025 Fischer Indoor Junior Nationals, with the U16 division starting today in Verdun, Quebec at the Club de tennis Île des Soeurs.

Following the start of the U16 event, which runs from March 21 to 28, the U12 tournament is scheduled to be held at the OSTEN & VICTOR Alberta Tennis Centre in Calgary, Alberta, from March 22 to 29. Then, the U18 division will compete at Sobeys Stadium in Toronto, Ontario, from March 29 to April 5, while the U14 players head to the UBC Tennis Centre in Vancouver, British Columbia, from March 31 to April 6.

"We always look forward to the Fischer Indoor Junior Nationals, as they essentially mark the start of the junior tennis season in Canada," said Ryan Borczon, Senior Director of Professional and National Events at Tennis Canada. "Not only are they the first national junior events of the year, but they're also very important ones for the players. Over the years, the Nationals have allowed players to establish a name for themselves, as the country's next stars have often been crowned champions, including our top-ranked players Leylah Annie Fernandez and Félix Auger-Aliassime."

The first edition of the indoor junior event was held in 1979, featuring only the U18 division. In 1985, the U14 division was added, followed by the U16 in 1988. The youngest division, U12, was introduced in 2006, giving all junior age categories the opportunity to compete at the national level.

Participants across all four divisions this year include several players from the National Tennis Centre presented by Rogers, the Regional Training Centres in Vancouver, Toronto, and Montreal, as well as members of the U15 Canadian Prospect Team.
