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DENIS SHAPOVALOV NAMED OFFICIAL AMBASSADOR OF ROGERS FIRST SET, COMMITTED TO GROWING TENNIS AND GIVING BACK TO CANADIAN YOUTH

Davis Cup champion to inspire next generation through national grassroots program and help Tennis Canada achieve goal of getting 100,000 more youth playing tennis by 2027

The fact it provides opportunities for young Canadians to take their first steps onto the court was a huge factor because I want to help grow the game as much as possible and introduce people of all ages and abilities to the sport I love so much. To be able to play a part in that feels pretty special."

Founded in partnership with Rogers in 2023, First Set is delivered in collaboration with Canada's Provincial and Territorial Tennis Associations (PTTAs) and aims to inspire participants to develop fundamental skills in a fun, welcoming, safe, and positive environment. The program is delivered through four key pillars: Try, Learn, Play, and Compete, and takes a holistic approach – focusing as much on the development of the person as the player.

The agreement also sees Shapovalov, ranked No. 29 on the ATP Tour, become an official Rogers athlete.

"We're proud to welcome Denis Shapovalov to Team Rogers as the first-ever ambassador of Rogers First Set," said Terrie Tweddle, Chief Brand and Communications Officer, Rogers. "As one of Canada's top ranked players and a strong advocate for youth in sport, Denis is the perfect role model to help inspire the next generation of Canadian tennis stars."

As part of Tennis Month in Canada, which is being celebrated this month in partnership with the PTTAs. over 100 registered Rogers First Set events are being delivered across the country.

"At Tennis Canada, we have a goal to get 100,000 more youth playing tennis by 2027, and Rogers First Set will play a major role in making that happen," said Eva Havaris, Senior Vice President, Tennis

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Development and Partnerships. "The research shows that tennis is a sport for all, for life - but it is our responsibility to ensure that there is tennis programming available across the country that is accessible. welcoming, safe and inclusive for families and youth in communities coast-to-coast-to-coast.
