## HARRIET DART CAPTURES TEVLIN CHALLENGER TITLE

Viktoria Hruncakova and Anastasia Tikhonova take home the doubles crown

[TORONTO, ON] November 2, 2025 - Harriet Dart of Great Britain claimed the biggest title of her career on Sunday at the 2025 edition of the Tevlin Challenger, defeating Fiona Crawley of the United States 6-2. 6-2 in the championship match. Held at Sobeys Stadium in Toronto, Ontario, the International Tennis Federation (ITF) W75 tournament celebrated its 20th anniversary, having welcomed some of the world's best players since 2005.

En route to the final, Dart, the No. 3 seed, defeated Switzerland's Jenny Duerst 6-1, 6-3 and fellow Brit Amelia Rajecki 6-2, 6-0 in the first and second round, respectively. Her toughest test of the week came in the quarter-finals, where she edged past No. 5 seed Viktoria Hruncakova of Slovakia 6-4, 2-6, 6-3, before beating Toronto's Katherine Sebov 6-4, 6-0 in the semi-finals.

Crawley's path to the final included victories over American compatriots Kayla Day, Rasheeda McAdoo, and defending champion and No. 1 seed Louisa Chirico. In the semi-finals, she defeated Kayla Cross of London, Ontario in a tight three-set contest 7-5, 3-6, 6-2.

In today's final, Dart broke Crawley's first service game and never looked back, clinching the title in a quick one-hour and four-minute match. The No. 3 seed converted four of nine break points and saved both break points she faced. This singles title is the seventh of Dart's career and her first at a W75 event. Thanks to her performance in Toronto, Dart will re-enter the Top 200 in the world rankings on Monday.

In the doubles final, Hruncakova and her partner Anastasia Tikhonova defeated the American duo of Crawley and Jaeda Daniel 6-4, 6-2. Hruncakova and Tikhonova did not lose a set throughout the tournament to claim their first title as a team. Last week, at the Saguenay National Bank Challenger, the two players faced each other in the singles final of the W75 event, where Tikhonova came out of on top by a score of 6-3, 6-2.
