GABRIELA DABROWSKI CLAIMS DOUBLES TITLE AT INTERNATIONAUX DE STRASBOURG

Canadian set to climb to No. 4 in WTA Tour's doubles rankings on Monday

[TORONTO, ON] May 23, 2026 – Canadian Gabriela Dabrowski (Ottawa, ON) and Brazil's Luisa Stefani claimed the Internationaux de Strasbourg women's doubles title with a 7-5, 6-4 victory over the United States' Quinn Gleason and Norway's Ulrikke Eikeri on Saturday. The WTA 500-level event serves as the final clay-court tune-up ahead of the 2026 edition of Roland-Garros.

"It's always tougher at the end of a tournament to feel fresh mentally, so for me it was a little bit about managing some tiredness," said Gabriela Dabrowski. "Like Luisa [Stefani] mentioned, this is only our second clay-court tournament, so maybe we're not as match-fit as we were in the first quarter of the season. We did a really good job early this week, both on and off the court, to keep improving – and that's what helped us today get through and win the title."

In the singles final, fellow Canadian and No. 1 seed Victoria Mboko (Burlington, ON) lost to Emma Navarro of the United States 6-0, 5-7, 6-2.

- Dabrowski now owns 22 Tour-level doubles titles, including four alongside Stefani.
- She is the second Canadian to win Strasbourg in doubles, joining Sonya Jeyaseelan (2000, 2003).
- The victory marks the fourth clay-court title of her career.
- The 34-year-old will climb up to No. 4 in the doubles rankings on Monday.
- Dabrowski now turns her attention to Roland-Garros, where she awaits the results of the doubles draw.
