GABRIELA DABROWSKI WINS THIRD TITLE OF THE SEASON AT LEXUS EASTBOURNE OPEN

[TORONTO, ON] June 28, 2026 – Gabriela Dabrowski (Ottawa, ON) won her third title of the season on Sunday, partnering with Brazil’s Luisa Stefani to defeat Czech pair Miriam Skoch and Jesika Maleckova 6-1, 6-4 in the doubles final at the WTA 250 Lexus Eastbourne Open.

“I love this event so much – it’s one of my favourites on Tour, and I always get excited to come back and play here,” Dabrowski said during the on-court ceremony. “It was a great week, and we had so much fun both on and off the court. Congratulations to our opponents, too. It was a pleasure to share the court with you, and we wish you all the best this season.”

MEDIA NOTES

- It marks Dabrowski’s 23rd career WTA title, including five with Stefani.
- Her third title of the season, matching a career high (also achieved in 2018, 2022 and 2025).
- The victory marks her fourth career grass-court title.
- The 34-year-old previously won Eastbourne in 2018 alongside China’s Xu Yifan.
- Next up is Wimbledon, where Dabrowski and Stefani are the No. 2 seeds. They face Chile’s Alexa Guarachi and Poland’s Alicja Rosolska in the first round.
