2026 REPENTIGNY NATIONAL BANK JUNIOR TENNIS CHAMPIONSHIPS PLAYER LIST ANNOUNCED, LED BY DEFENDING CHAMPION AND WORLD NO. 2 KSENIA EFREMOVA

Avery Alexander and Joshua Adamson lead the Canadian contingent in their respective draws

[TORONTO, ON] August 25, 2026 – Canada's highest-graded junior event on the World Tennis Tour, the J300 Repentigny National Bank Junior Tennis Championships (ITJR), today announced its player list for the 2026 edition, set to take place at Parc Larochelle in Repentigny, Quebec, from August 29 to September 4.

"We're delighted to welcome another world-class field to Repentigny this year," said Janie Vigneault, tournament director of the ITJR. "With top-ranked juniors from around the world and several talented Canadians competing on home soil, fans can expect an exciting week of high-level tennis. We're proud to continue this longstanding tradition at Parc Larochelle and encourage everyone to come out and watch the next generation of stars in action – admission is free!"

Leading the way in the girls' draw is defending champion Ksenia Efremova of France, ranked No. 2 in the world junior rankings. The 17-year-old won the 2026 Australian Open junior singles title and will be joined by an impressive field, including Australia's Renee Alame (No. 38), Hungary's Lujza Beviz (No. 42), Ukraine's Antonina Sushkova (No. 43), and Italy's Ilary Postola (No. 46).

On the boys' side, Germany's Vincent Reisach will be the top seed, ranked No. 11 in the world junior rankings. The 17-year-old also captured the boys' doubles title at Roland-Garros earlier this season. Brazil's Leonardo Storck Franca (No. 23), Italy's Raffaele Ciurnelli (No. 25), Spain's Tito Chavez (No. 26), and Italy's Simone Massellani (No. 28) round out the Top 5.

Canada's top-ranked player in the girls' main draw, Avery Alexander, enters the tournament ranked No. 68. The 16-year-old recently competed in qualifying at the WTA 1000 National Bank Open presented by Rogers, falling 6-4, 6-4 to a Top 100 player on the WTA Tour, Polina Kudermetova. Alexander also captured a J200 title earlier this season. She is joined by Canadians Clemence Mercier (No. 130), Andrea Cabio (No. 168), and Elicia Lin (No. 199).

Four Canadians will compete in the boys' main draw, led by Joshua Adamson, ranked No. 70 and a two-time J200 champion this season. Xavier Massotte follows at No. 71, while Felix Roussel enters the tournament ranked No. 81, and Antoine G  n  reux is ranked No. 121.
