LEYLAH ANNIE FERNANDEZ CAPTURES THE SINGAPORE TENNIS OPEN TITLE

Today's win marks Fernandez' first title of the season and the sixth title of her career

[TORONTO, ON] September 27, 2026 — Leylah Annie Fernandez (Laval, QC) captured her first title of the season on Sunday, defeating Talia Gibson of Australia 7-5, 6-0 in the women's singles final at the Singapore Tennis Open presented by BNP Paribas. Fernandez entered the tournament as the No. 6 seed.

Capturing the win at the WTA 500 event today marks the sixth title of Fernandez' career. Prior to today's victory, Fernandez' most recent title was earned at the 2025 Kinoshita Group Japan Open where she won against Tereza Valentova of Czechia in a 6-0, 5-7, 6-3 final.

- Fernandez now owns two WTA 500 titles; she previously won the 2025 Mubadala Citi DC Open against Anna Kalinskaya 6-1, 6-2.
- Today marks Fernandez' ninth career appearance in a final, where she holds a 6-3 record. Prior to today, her most recent appearance in a final was at the 2025 Kinoshita Group Japan Open where she captured the title.
- All six of Fernandez' titles have been earned on hard court. Her best Grand Slam result was also on hard court where she appeared in the final of the 2021 US Open, finishing as the runner-up to Emma Raducanu by a score of 6-4, 6-3.
- Highlights of Fernandez' 2026 season also includes three appearances in the quarter-finals, most recently at the Internationaux de Strasbourg presented by Mammotion (WTA 500) in May.
